



## Lincoln University Ngāti Moki Trophy for Māori Leadership Dr Lloyd Carpenter

The Ngāti Moki Trophy, inaugurated in 2008 as a gift from Te Taumutu Rūnanga to Lincoln University, is awarded each year to a person who has shown considerable leadership and commitment to Māori development and advancement at Lincoln University.

Senior Lecturer in Māori Studies at Lincoln University, Dr Lloyd Carpenter, has demonstrated that commitment.

Dr Carpenter works to open his students' eyes to Aotearoa's history, the significance and place of the Treaty of Waitangi, and Māori culture.

His passion for the topic has been responsible for igniting similar passions in his students.

Many of his students have named Dr Carpenter as the most influential lecturer of their university career, as well as their favourite.

He is a supportive lecturer and will often go out of his way to help, whether it be academically or emotionally.

He has shown he is very empathetic to Māori students when they experience difficulties around being away from home and whānau, and is known to support them with their course work.
